Vigil 1: End of Barn

Throughout the entire vigil I could see a white/grey shifting mass in the area of the doorway leading to the stairs area. Constantly changing shape, sometimes moving closer to the main door of the barn and sometimes more dense than others.

The name Andrew Gillard/Gilliard came to me. Later I had the image of a youngish man, mid 40's, dark slightly wavy hair. A rider, but didn't own his own horse. Well liked man.

Four footsteps heard from the kitchen area.

White lights seen moving high on the wall to my right, moving towards the end of the barn.

At the end of the vigil a flood of witchcraft images and symbols.

Vigil 3: Bar Area

I felt generally uneasy in this area.

Movement heard in kitchen area.

Constant scratching from outside the barn (tree).

Knocking noises to my right, behind the bar and I felt I didn't want to look at the bar.

Knocking on the stairs (although I didn't realise there was another team member sitting on the stairs).

I had the image of an older (late 50's) redheaded man. From the Red Lion, had been made redundant because he was too old, although he was laughing and saying it in a tongue-in-cheek way. Pete or Peter.
