

Bull's Green & Thundridge

In March LPS returned to two investigation sites in Hertfordshire for further investigation.

Clibbon's post marks the spot where local criminal Walter Clibbon was buried in 1782. Groans, the sound of horse's hooves and a horse's shadow pulling a figure have been reported.

On Bramfield Road in the 1980s a man driving down this road witnessed a mysterious woman in white step out in front of his car. After braking and ending up some way down the road he returned to the spot to find absolutely nothing.

LPS previously visited the site back in 2004 with some interesting results and returning to the site provided more interesting experiences.

Two members independently witnessed what was noted as a 'white' and 'wispy' figure move across the road at the same time whilst being several meters apart. An old man and the name of 'Jack' was sensed, along with the feeling of only being able to see out of one eye. The impression of a grey speckled horse was sensed more than once during time spent at Bull's Green. Flashes of red light were also seen when at this location.

The last visit to Old Thundridge Church was in 2009 but LPS did not make it on to the site due to a group of youths already there and looked to stay and have a bit of a scare fest!

On this visit, LPS did make it on to the site but again a popular site for youths, LPS did not get much time to investigate freely. No vigils were conducted but general feelings from the site during a walk around were warmth, welcoming, calm and peace. The alleged haunting of the site suggests a different atmosphere. In 1978 a woman walking home came to the church only to see fires burning within it and the sound of people shouting. As she stood there, she saw a troop of soldiers come rushing towards her. Unable to move from fright, the soldiers passed her and simply melted away.
