Background –

I was on an early morning Cycle from my house in Bushmead – a circular route of around 25k.

I left my house at about 630am in Bushmead. The weather was dominated by high pressure. By the time I reached Wigmore it was very misty/foggy. Although the sun was rising it was not visible as the mist was blocking it out.

Its worth noting that the night before there was an earthquake in Leighton Buzzard.

What Happened –

As I was cycling along Hayling Drive Towards Tea Green, I turned off the main road onto the cycle path that runs along the outskirts of Luton. I went about 10 yards on the cycle path and noticed in the corner of my eye a bright light to me left. At first, I thought this was the sun, but stopped to look.

I saw a bright orb hovering above the ground, it looked like it was a mixture of gasses and was swirling around. I would say it was about 6-foot-high and a perfect sphere. I stopped to observe it trying to work out what it was. At this point it started to move, it moved along the edges of the treeline, it was a very bright Orange colour. I can only describe it as a rolling ball of fire. It got to the end of the treeline and vanished.

By this point I had started to take off my backpack and look for my mobile phone, as I did this it vanished. So, I have no idea in what direction it vanished.

What did I see?

The Sun ? – this is the most obvious explanation, as the sun rises in the same direction. However, it was not the sun I saw, the sun does not move at great speed. Plus, at this point the sun was further west.

Ball Lightning – This is the most likely explanation to what I saw. There are plenty of videos online of this and they closely resemble what I saw. The area was also subject to earthquakes the night before I wonder if this could be a factor.

Reflection of aircraft lights – The airport is only a mile or so away, it could be argued I saw aircraft fog lights; however, the location of the sighting is not on the flightpath. And what I saw was an intense orange glow, plus I did not see or hear any aircraft in the sky.

A UFO – What I saw was hovering slightly off the ground so could be classified as a UFO. This doesn't mean it came from Mars or has extra-terrestrial involvement but its something that we can't discount.

Flying orbs and Balls of fire are one of the most common sightings of UFO. These Orbs could be friend or foe or even from another world. However rare you think this possibility might be it can't be discounted.

What Next....?

I would think what I saw warrants some kind of investigation – I revisited the spot later that same day to see if I could see any scorch marks or burn marks. I could not. It would be interesting to know if anyone else has seen anything like this in the Luton Area. To be continued.....
