

Akeley & Newton Longville

The site investigated in Akeley marks the church remains of St James the Apostle which was demolished in 1982. Three vigils were conducted by three small teams from approximately 9-11pm. During the vigils, members in different teams reported similar experiences including seeing dark shapes and figures, hearing clicks around the graveyard and white lights and mists. Two members also experienced their batteries draining in equipment despite being full charged and replaced during the investigation.

The most interesting experience came from one member who started to hear *Pater Noster* (The Lord's Prayer) and saw a white cowled monk in their mind's eye. Having this impression, they asked their team leader 'is it a white cowled monk?' When the church was intact and in use, the churchwarden was taking a rest from cleaning the church when she saw a white cowled monk standing by the font. It reached out its hand to her and the next thing she knew the cleaning had been completed yet she could not recall moving from the pew. The member who had seen this monk in her mind's eye did not know the haunting of this location.
